
All of whom won a medal and certificate for their efforts – well done!

Congratulations to all the children who have managed 100% attendance in the first week back after the half term holiday – 81% of our pupils have achieved that this week! However, despite this fantastic achievement, our overall attendance remains at 91.6% - still well below our target of 96%.

It is extremely important for your child to be in school whenever possible. A pupil's attendance will directly affect their achievement in school. Evidence shows that a pupil's progress and attainment is affected if their attendance falls below 90%.

100% attendance is 190 days in school.
