## **OPAL at Highters Heath**

## Spotlight on Attendance

Attendance is an extremely important issue, so much so that the government has launched a national campaign to remind parents and carers of the importance of school attendance, with the strapline "Moments Matter, Attendance Counts". We will be using this guidance to further develop our support for families whose children may have attendance difficulties. Our whole school attendance is particularly low this week at 89.8% so please remember the colour coded guide to help you decide whether to send your child to school or not.

**RED** - **STAY AT HOME** Sickness and diarrhoea - 24 hours must have elapsed before a child can return to school from the last episode.

AMBER - SEEK ADVICE Headache, feeling sick, tummy ache. Children often feel unwell if they are anxious, so if in doubt contact the school for advice, and if appropriate a dose of liquid paracetamol or ibuprofen before school may be all they need to help them feel well enough to attend.

GREEN - COME TO SCHOOL Mild cough, cold, sore throat, feeling tired. We will always contact you if your child is ill during the school day.
