If your child's attendance falls below 90%, we may send you a letter or invite you to attend a meeting as part of the school's attendance procedures. Please be reassured that in the first instance this is done in a supportive capacity, as sometimes you may be unaware that your child's attendance has fallen so low or there may be some difficulties you are having that we can help you with.

Attendance can be categorised using a traffic light system.

Green – attendance is 95% or above

Amber – attendance is consistently below 95%

Red – persistent absentee below 90%
