#### **Spotlight on attendance**

Punctuality is an extremely important part of attendance. Being late for school has many negative consequences:

- Gets the day off to a bad start
- Increases stress and upset for your child
- Can lead to your child feeling embarrassed and singled out
- Affects your child's overall confidence
- Disrupts the learning of other class members
- Creates bad habits which can lead to poor attendance
- Confusion for your child as work or activities may have started.

The school doors open at 8.45am and registers are at 8.55am. Being late on a regular basis adds up to a loss of learning time.

5 minutes late every day	3.4 days of lost learning every year
10 minutes late every day	6.9 days of lost learning every year
15 minutes late every day	10.3 days of lost learning every year
20 minutes late every day	13.8 days of lost learning every year
30 minutes late every day	20.7 days of lost learning every year
