Home Learning Projects







I just wanted to highlight some more of the amazing home learning projects that have come into school over the last few weeks. Well done to everyone for bringing these in. Over the half term please encourage your child to make something, read a book or practise times tables. We would love to hear what they have been doing when they come back.

Spotlight on Attendance

Attendance at Highters Heath last year was generally good, with our school often having the highest attendance of all the schools in Excelsior MAT, something we were extremely proud of. However, this term has not been as good as it normally is. So far this year our whole school attendance is at only 91.9%, whereas at this point last year it was 95%. You will remember that we are aiming for 96% and above and you can see we are some way away from that at the moment. However, we would like to say well done to all the children who have attended school every day so far this year. 48% of our pupils have attendance of 96% and above, with 31% of our pupils having 100% attendance. Whilst we recognise that there are times when children get ill and are not well enough to attend school, we encourage you to send your child in whenever possible.

Remember the traffic light guide to helping you make a decision as to whether to send your child to school or not.

RED - STAY AT HOME Sickness and diarrhoea - 24 hours must have elapsed before a child can return to school from the last episode.

AMBER - SEEK ADVICE Headache, feeling sick, tummy ache. Children often feel unwell if they are anxious, so if in doubt contact the school for advice, and if appropriate a dose of liquid paracetamol or ibuprofen before school may be all they need to help them feel well enough to attend.

GREEN - COME TO SCHOOL Mild cough, cold, sore throat, feeling tired. We will always contact you if your child is ill during the school day.

If your child is too ill to attend school, please contact the school office before 9.30am with full details of your child's illness/symptoms. If we do not hear from you, we will ring you to find out why your child is not in school and if necessary, make a home visit. If you are having difficulties getting your child to school on time and would like any support, please contact Mrs Lindsay.
