Uniform

Spotlight on attendance

At Highters Heath Community School we take attendance and punctuality very seriously. We aim to have an attendance figure in excess of the national average of 96%. Attendance data is tracked by the Department for Education and will adversely affect our Ofsted rating if it is below the required level.

Our current attendance percentage is 96% and we MUST improve on this figure. We categorise levels of attendance into red, amber and green.

GREEN - 100%. Excellent attendance above the national expected average, ideally where all children should aim to be.

AMBER - 96.7% or above. Good attendance - in line with or above national expected average.

RED - below 96.7%. Attendance below expected level.

We will be sending out a letter with further information about this next week.

We will monitor your child's attendance and if we do not see an improvement, we will contact you by letter to arrange a meeting to discuss how to support you and your child.
