

Sir Walter Raleigh (1552-1618) Florence Nightingale (1820 - 1910)




Neil Armstrong

On a bus, she was asked to give up her seat to a white person. She felt this was unfair, so she did not do this. She was arrested by the police. Lots of people were unhappy about this.

Eventually the laws were changed. Rosa Park became a heroine.
