Class information

Welcome back. I hope you all had a lovely and restful summer. Already, we are straight into another busy term, and Year 2 has plenty of interesting work to look forward to.

<u>Maths:</u>

This term we will be learning about numbers up to 100. We will practise counting forwards and backwards from any number and finding one more and one less of different numbers.

We will also be learning about partitioning numbers using tens and ones and counting in steps of 2, 5, 10 and 3.

English:

This term we have been looking at narrative and non-fiction texts based around the Great Fire of London. We will be focusing on writing in full sentences that make sense and punctuating them correctly. We will also learn about using expanded noun phrases and conjunctions in our writing.

Science:
