Dear Parents and Carers,

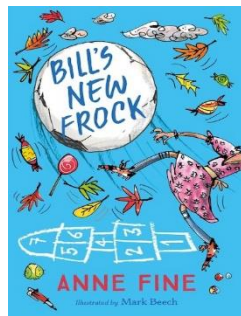
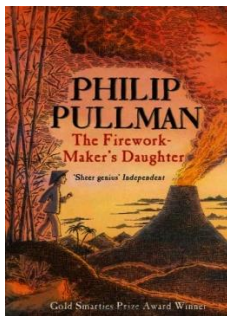
Welcome back!

English

In our Reading lessons we will be reading 'Bill's New Frock' by Anne Fine. It is a story about a boy who wakes up as a girl and spends the day as the opposite gender. Bill feels out-of-sorts because he is in the wrong body, and through observing with a child's innocent eyes the differences in the way people treat him, we see ourselves and society as we know it.

We will also be reading 'The Firework Makers Daughter' by Phillip Pullman. What Lila wants to be more than anything else in the world is . . . a Firework-Maker! But firework-making is not just about being able to make Crackle-Dragons and Golden Sneezes. There is also one special secret: every Firework-Maker must make a perilous journey to face the terrifying Fire-Fiend! Not knowing that she needs special protection to survive the Fire-Fiend's flames, Lila sets off alone. Will she survive?



In our English lessons, we will be writing a persuasive text linked to the narrative 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' by Joe Todd Stanton.

We will also be writing a letter to inform based on the text, 'The Queen of Darkness' by Tony Bradman, which we started to use as our reading text earlier in the year.

Maths

In maths, we will be continuing to focus on multiplication and division. It is vital that children learn their timetables. Remember to use [TTRockstars.com](https://www.TTRockstars.com) to practice at home as often as possible. We will also be looking at; decimals, money, area and perimeter, measure, geometry and Roman numerals. You could use www.topmarks.co.uk and www.timestables.com to help support at home.

Curriculum Theme

In theme, we will be discovering Antarctica and learning about this icy continent. We will learn about the different explorers and expeditions that have taken place through history. You could begin to find out about the animals who live in Antarctica and locate it on a world map.

In Music, we will continue to work with our music teacher and work towards a performance, later in the term.

In RE, we will be learning about living by rules and being imaginative and creative.
