

Rainforests

Useful Words

Africa - One of the world's seven continents.

Anansi - Anansi often appears in many West African stories. It is often a spider, who manages to trick other much larger animals.

continent - One of the Earth's seven major areas of land.

desert - A place that gets very little rainfall. They contain lots of sand and few things grow there.

habitat - A place where animals or plants live.

Maasai tribe - A tribe of people who live in a country called Kenya.

mane - Long, heavy hair growing around the neck of a lion.

mountain - Tall hills that are made from rocks and earth.

pride - The name given to a group of lions.

rainforest - An area filled with trees which gets lots of rain.

savanna - An area, which has grass and plants, and which doesn't get much rain. There are few trees here.

tusk - A long pointed tooth used for fighting or digging. Elephants have these.

Anansi the Spider

A character in many African stories. He is clever and likes to trick other animals.





The Maasai Tribe

There are many different tribes who live in the **continent** of Africa. One of the tribes is the **Maasai** tribe. They are considered to be one of the tallest people in the world.




The Big Five African Animals

A fully-grown African Elephant weighs the same as 80 human adults!






Fun Fact

Fun Fact

There are five types of rhinoceros in the world. Two of these live in Africa (the black rhino and the white rhino). These rhinos have two horns. The name rhinoceros means giant horns.



<u>Fun Fact</u>

Lion cubs are born with blue eyes. They change colour to amber or brown at the age of two to three months.
