Spotlight on Attendance

Some interesting facts and information relating to attendance – your child's school attendance matters.

· All schools must report their termly attendance percentages to the Local Authority.

· If your child is not in school s/he does not reach her/his learning potential.

 \cdot Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child receives a full-time education.

 Parents can be issued with Fixed Penalty Notices (fines) for failing to ensure that their child attends school regularly - this includes taking children out of school on holiday, and excess 'lates'.
The Local Authority has the power to prosecute parents in the Magistrates Court for the offence of failing to ensure their child attends school regularly.

• If your child arrives after 9:25am we are required to mark them as having unauthorised absence for the whole morning - arriving after 9:25am once in a week brings their attendance down to 90% for that week.

 \cdot Children with less than 85% attendance at school are unlikely to gain 5 Grade 9-4 GCSEs (A-C with old GCSE grades) or any qualifications.
